

Environmental Management Concurrent Session

- **Engage GLC member states more actively for direction on priorities related to land use; develop mechanisms for coordinating input from the states.**
- **Makeup of GLC commissioners may limit its ability to address land use (e.g., lack of commissioners from ag, transportation and forestry agencies).**
- **Depending on the issue, it may be difficult for the GLC to speak with one voice.**
- **GLC should focus on areas where it can have the greatest impact; will this include land use?**

(continued)

- **GLC has a clear role in disseminating information, sharing success stories, etc.**
- **GLC can advocate for large, regional programs and investigations. Illustrate regional impacts of land-use decisions at the state and local level for the benefit of decision-makers at those levels.**
- **GLC should advocate for programs and resources that help monitor and track land-use impacts (e.g., support for USGS gauging stations to monitoring sedimentation in rivers).**
- **Address regional priorities without infringing on state interests (e.g., support for Farm Bill reauthorization). Look for “wins” for both the region and the states. Concern about influencing statewide issues.**
